Certificate Program Requirements

Certificate programs consist of a specified set of academic courses that focus on a specific topic, representing a coherent and relatively free-standing body of knowledge. Successful completion of a certificate signifies the achievement of competence in the specified domain and is recognized by the awarding of a certificate (an official document) from the sponsoring department or program. Completion of certificate programs approved by the College will also be noted on the official student transcript.

Requirements for Certificate Students

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- At least 50% of the coursework toward the certificate must be earned at Fort Lewis College.
- Both degree-seeking and unclassified students may be admitted to a certificate program.
- Certificate coursework may also be applied in fulfillment of requirements for departmental majors or minors, there is no discrete credit requirement for certificates.
- Course substitutions within a certificate program may be requested by a student but require written approval of both the program director and the appropriate dean.
- Courses taken prior to admission to the certificate program can be counted toward the certificate only with the program director's specific approval.
